



The San Antonio Chapter hosted two mentor lunches with the Fox Tech High School Law and Research Magnet Program.





Member Spotlight – Leslie Hyman



Service on FBA: As long as she can remember. She joined during her clerkship with Judge Edward Prado beginning in 1994.

Positions Served on FBA: Board member since 2006, Outreach Committee coordinating Fox Tech girls lunch; Law Day contest; Lunch Speaker Committee; Newsletter Committee.

Favorite FBA project over the years: Fox Tech girls lunch.

Other community organizations: Serves on the Board of the Bexar County Women's Bar Association; the Board of the San Antonio Bar Association Appellate Section; the State Bar Committee on the Administration of the Rules of Evidence; Vice-Chair of SABA Federal Courts Committee.

Pathway to today: Attended A&M University, transferred to Brandeis Univ. graduating with a degree in psychology. After several years of working, Leslie decided to attend law school where she graduated from Hastings College of the Law in California. She completed a two-year clerkship with Judge Prado (then a US District Judge) and proceeded to Cox Smith Matthews, Inc. where she practiced from 1996 to 2011. Leslie joined Pulman, Cappuccio, Pullen, Benson & Jones, LLP in 2011 as a partner where she practices in the areas of appellate, commercial litigation, and antitrust/trade regulation.

Things you may not know about Leslie:

- Judge Prado and Judge Bemporad are credited for introducing Leslie and her husband Phil Lynch, an Assistant Federal Public Defender. After several attempts at an introduction during her clerkship, Leslie and Phil finally met and bonded over their shared interest in music and pop culture. Leslie and Phil married in 1998.

Member Spotlight – Col William C. Kirk USA (Ret)



Service on FBA: Since 2001.

Positions Served on FBA: Served as a Board member his first year as Military Liaison; Chairman of Membership Committee; served all officer positions culminating in President 2008-2009.

Favorite FBA projects over the years: Supporting Joan Gluys to establish the Government Contract Committee; serving on the Federal Court Practice Seminar committee; serving on the National Government Relations Committee for the National FBA.

Other community organizations: Serves on the Board of Operation Homefront – Texas Chapter, an organization that assists lower enlisted service members and their families.

Pathway to today: 30+ years in active service with the U.S. Army retiring as a Colonel. Practiced in many different fields, including criminal law, appellate, civil federal litigation (Army defense), and military policy. Some of his posts included serving as staff JAG, Chief Advocate for the Army Medical Command, Chief Legal Advisor to the Surgeon General, Chief of Tort Claims for the Army, and General Counsel for the Army & Air Force Exchange Service (PX). Bill retired on February 1, 2003.

Things you may not know about Bill:

- He's a historical US flag nut. He collects historical flags from throughout US's storied history.
- Bill knows a thing or two about fashion. Bill
 rubbed elbows with all the big names in fashion
 during his service as the General Counsel for the
